### **ACCOMMODATION** Are you happy with your accommodation?

Do you know your journey to/from school or would you like some help planning it?



- Does your host family and the school have YOUR mobile number?
- Do you have the telephone number and address of your ACCOMMODATION?
- Do you know your curfew (what time you have to be home)?
- 16 / 17 years old = 10pm at the latest.
- 15 years old or younger = **9pm** at the latest.

Please keep in contact with your host and tell them what time you will be home, if not they will worry about you.

### E-Safety – stay SMART

Safe Do not give your personal details to anyone online (e.g., full name, contact details).

Meet Do not meet with people who you have met online as it can be dangerous.

Accept Do not accept messages, emails or open files from people you do not know or trust

as some can contain viruses or nasty messages.

Reliable Some information may be untrue or people can lie about who they are.

Always check information with other websites, books or a member of staff.

<u>Tell</u> If something makes you feel uncomfortable or worried tell your parent, host parent or a staff member.

### **EVERY DAY Safety**

Apply the above E-Safety rules to everyday life and be careful with your personal information. Are you meeting someone new? Make sure you meet them in a public place or go with a friend, especially at night time.

## BELONGINGS / VALUABLES (e.g. mobiles, cameras, money)

Please keep your personal belongings and valuables safe and not on show for everybody to see. Do not leave your belongings unattended.

## ALCOHOL <a href="https://www.gov.uk/alcohol-young-people-law">https://www.gov.uk/alcohol-young-people-law</a>

Do not accept drinks from someone you do not know. If you are under 18 and you try to buy or drink alcohol in public, you can be stopped, fined or arrested by the police. You must be 18 years or over to buy or to drink alcohol in public places. Some bars and nightclubs have a 21 years+ policy. It is illegal to buy for or sell alcohol to anyone under 18 years old. In some outdoor places, the police can confiscate alcohol. In London, these areas may be called Alcohol Control Areas (ACAs), Controlled Drinking Areas (CDAs) or Controlled Drinking Zones (CDZs). These areas will be clearly signposted. You are not allowed to drink alcohol on London buses, trams, tubes and the DLR.

#### **DRUGS**

You are not allowed to buy, sell or use illegal drugs in the UK.

**SOCIAL PROGRAMME** If you would like to attend any social activities, we will need your parent/guardian's consent (under 18 only). Sorry, but some trips are for students who are 18+, please check at reception.



### TRAVELLING AROUND LONDON

Bloomsbury International school is in Holborn (Underground station on the <u>Piccadilly line</u> and/or <u>Central line</u>). For further information on journeys, including bus routes, please visit this useful website <u>www.tfl.gov.uk</u>. If you travel by bus, sit near the driver – it is the safest place.

Transport is not 24 hours ... check before you travel (last bus / tube / train / night buses)

Emergency – we suggest that you carry £10.00 - £15.00, just in case you need to take a taxi at any time.

Where possible, travel with another student or friend and use main roads with street lamps.

Only use Licensed Taxis and book a taxi in advance: <a href="https://www.tfl.gov.uk/modes/taxis-and-minicabs/book-a-taxi">https://www.tfl.gov.uk/modes/taxis-and-minicabs/book-a-taxi</a>
For emergency only, you can hail a black cab on the street. Do not get into a stranger's car or into an unlicensed taxi.

The British police and security agencies work hard to protect the public. In the event of an incident in London they advise to: RUN, HIDE and TELL.

Run to a safe place, turn your phone onto silent mode and stay hidden, if it is safe, call 999 and tell the police where you are.

### **ROAD SAFETY**

Only cross at crossings and look both ways. Look for all vehicles, including bicycles.

Wait for the traffic to stop – you can press the button on the traffic lights and wait for the green man.
